Terms of Reference (ToR)

Position title: WASH Contractor

Reporting to: Country Manger - Tonga

Advised by: Director of WASH - Melbourne

General: This position is based in Nuku'alofa, Tonga

Live & Learn is a network of national Live & Learn organisations active in 11 countries across Southeast Asia and the Pacific, which operate under the common goal of “a sustainable and equitable world free from poverty”.

Live & Learn Tonga is a nationally registered non-governmental organisation in Tonga. We are active members and key influencers in the HN WASH, Food Security and Livelihood (FSL), and Social Protection Clusters. We respond to requests from NEMO and clusters to deliver actions such as rapid damage assessment, detailed assessment, formulation of Disaster Response Plan, and provision of regular Situation Reports from work with target communities. Live & Learn provides a link with communities, undertaking vital community-based services that are often left unattended by the Public services and Clusters, which are focused on working at a broader policy and national level. This provides a bridge between strategy, and on-ground works with communities having a strong voice.

The project 'WASH Resilience and Rehabilitation in Tonga: Phase 2' is funded by the Australian Government through the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT). Purpose of the project is to support post-cyclone WASH recovery and resilience efforts in the worst impacted areas on Tongatapu and 'Eua.

Role:

The purpose of the WASH Contractor will be to support the local Live & Learn Tonga team in developing Rehabilitation Plans, Procurement Plans, and lead the WASH-related construction works in the framework of the project 'WASH Resilience and Rehabilitation in Tonga: Phase 2'.

Qualifications and experience:

- A tertiary qualification water engineering, civil engineering, environmental health or related field.
- At least three years experience in related work, preferably in the non-governmental sector.

Skills and abilities:

- Extensive knowledge and/or experience in designing and constructing WASH facilities.
- Extensive knowledge and/or experience in operations and maintenance of WASH facilities.
- Sound cross-cultural and gender awareness, and networking skills.
- Excellent organisation and interpersonal skills.

Key responsibilities:

1. Support the local team in assessing needs for WASH facilities interventions at community level, including community halls and community water storage systems;
2. Facilitate formation, orientation and training of local staff in technical areas including building and maintaining quality WASH structures, as well as operations and maintenance of water and sanitation facilities;
3. Help to design Rehabilitation Plans, including systems to monitor the rehabilitation activities respects the timetable and deadlines.
4. Support the Procurement Coordinator in preparing plans, specifications and cost estimates of the construction works.
5. Completion of the WASH-related construction works carried out over the selected communities to a high, certifiable standard.
6. Carry out additional tasks as instructed by the Country Manager or Director of WASH.
